Course Description: This is the third course in a sequence of courses designed to provide students with a rigorous program of study in mathematics. It includes **Quadratic Functions, Polynomial Functions, Rational & Radical Relationships, Exponentials and Logarithms, Inferences & Conclusions from Data, Mathematical Modeling.**

Notebook: You must have a separate Honors Algebra 2 notebook or binder for worksheets, homework, loose-leaf and graph paper.

Calculators (TI-84 or TI-84 CE): For this course, you will need to purchase or check out (by availability) a graphing calculator. By having this calculator, you will be prepared for future math courses, SAT, ACT, and college course. The TI-36 will not be permitted in class.
