<u>Course Description</u>: This is the third course in a sequence of courses designed to provide students with a rigorous program of study in mathematics. It includes **Quadratic Functions**, **Polynomial Functions**, **Rational & Radical Relationships**, **Exponentials and Logarithms**, **Inferences & Conclusions from Data**, **Mathematical Modeling**.

<u>Calculators (TI-84 or TI-84 CE)</u>: For this course, you will need to purchase or check out (by availability) a graphing calculator. By having this calculator, you will be prepared for future math courses, SAT, ACT, and college course. The TI-36 <u>will not</u> be permitted in class.
